DISCUSSION GUIDE This Is Our Story -The Tabernacle

Text: Exodus 25:1-9

Warming Up

- 1. Have you ever been to a Temple? Where was it, and how did it make you feel?
- 2. Where or when do you (did you) feel the presence of God?

Digging In

Read Exodus 25:1-9

- 1. The LORD tells Moses to take an offering for the supplies needed. Why not just command the Israelites to give?
- 2. Why did Israel need this Tabernacle?

Skim Exodus 25:10-31:17

- 1. Why were the instructions for the Tabernacle, its furnishings, and the priestly functions so detailed?
- 2. Pastor Craig noted the Hebrew language parallel between these instructions and the creation story in Genesis. Find the 7 times where the text says, "And the LORD said to Moses..."
- 3. Do you see a symbolism that points to Jesus? Put yourself in the place of an ancient Israelite. What symbolism do you see now?

Read John 1:1-14

- 1. What images of the Tabernacle (or Temple) might John be drawing from in this text?
- 2. Pastor Craig noted that John chose the Greek word for "pitch a tent" when talking about the incarnation. Other than a possible allusion to the Tabernacle, why else might that be an appropriate word to use?
- 3. How does The Word pitch a tent with us today?

Read John 14:23; 17:20-21

- 1. What does it mean for the Father and Son to live with you?
- 2. How do we as all of God's people become the place where God dwells?
- 3. If God now dwells within and among us, how should we live out the reality of being the Tent or Tabernacle where God dwells in this world?
