They also shared their gifts and talents in various missions, including Mennonite Central Committee, several Mennonite camps, and Habitat for Humanity where they worked alongside Jimmy and Rosalyn Carter building homes in Mexico.

Nelson was a man of many talents. During his adult life, he played golf for many years, expanding his friendships and allowing him to share his many stories and jokes. His tenor voice gave him the opportunity to sing in men's quartets. Nelson's love of family and his strong faith motivated many of his life pursuits. He entertained his children with his wiggling ears, riding a bicycle backward, and jumping over his arm among so many other things.

He was a gentle, caring, and generous man. He will be greatly missed by his friends and family.
